Where does the time go?

Tamba released some very exciting news earlier this year. They have teamed with Dr Asma Khalil and others to produce foetal growth charts for twins. This means that twins can be compared against twin growth data while still in the womb, instead of being compared against the singleton foetus growth charts. This will provide clinicians with more accurate data on how well the twins are progressing and if medical intervention is required. Congratulations to all involved in the research, fundraising and production of this work.

Dr Susan Griffith, the ICOMBO Research Director, has been busy putting together the information she collected from our Sole Parenting survey. She will be presenting the results of this research at Congress. I hope we will be able to produce literature for sole parent families as a result of this research.

I have been asked to contribute to a Twins and Community Forum, to be held in my home town of Melbourne, Australia, this month. At the forum, I will be representing ICOMBO and all parents of twins and higher order multiples. It is a great opportunity to meet with the research community and speak about our needs, rights and desires with regard to research.

Looking forward to our time together in Madrid and hope to see your organisation represented.

Multiple Births Naissances multiples

Celebrating over 35 years of supporting Canada's multiple-birth community...

Naissances multiples Multiple Births Canada (formerly Parents of Multiple Births Association {POMBA} Canada) was originally formed in 1978. Federally incorporated and federally incorporated as Multiple Births Canada in 2001, we remain, to this day, the only national support organization for multiple-birth families and individuals in Canada.

Multiple Births Canada's mission is to improve the quality of life for multiple birth individuals and their families in Canada. We fulfill our mission by providing support, education, research, and advocacy both nationally and internationally to individuals, families, Chapters, and organizations that have a personal or professional interest in multiple birth issues.

Over the last two years, MBC has undergone a shift in the services and supports we are offering, focusing more on strengthening our organization and providing direct support to our chapters, and member families. While MBC's past work on advocacy and enhancing our National and International presence was critical to our professional development, MBC recognizes that our chapters and families here in Canada need us to expand our reach and really highlight the unique challenges that they are facing.

Recently we have expanded our social media support by launching a Facebook Group for our existing <u>Loss Support Network</u>, and we launched a new Support Network for <u>Postpartum Depression and Anxiety</u>. We recognize that these situations can be extremely difficult for our members to deal with, and MBC wanted to support the multiple births community and let them know they are not alone.

MBC's 2017 National Multiple Births Awareness Day Theme was <u>Postpartum Emotional Support and Wellness for Multiple Births Families</u>. Nationally this theme resonated with many families - we received a number of personal stories from members which we shared on our electronic magazine website <u>Multiple Moments</u>, and we heard from families Coast to Coast who not only related to these stories, but wanted to share their own journey's. With this theme, we were also able to create three new <u>Fact Sheets</u>, again to reach more families and provide the support they need.

Currently the MBC Board of Directors is busy planning the 2017 MBC AGM and Volunteer Retreat being held in Ontario, Canada in October, 2017. This year MBC is hosting the event, and our theme is Planting Seeds to Help Chapters Bloom. We will be offering professional peer to peer training for our chapter volunteers which will help them to go back to their member families and help them through difficult situations like loss, postpartum depression, raising children with special needs, lone parenting, and more. We are very excited about how this will help our chapters and families directly, and strengthen the relationships between our chapters. MBC continues to work with chapters to provide the support and services that our families need.

MBC is also excited to be reaching more families this year, and will be launching our <u>First Moments Ultrasound Project</u> as well. We are hoping by marketing MBC directly to ultrasound clinics across Canada, more families will learn of MBC and access the supports and services we offer.

The current office structure of MBC includes the services of our Office Manager Theresa Sanders. Theresa started her national work with MBC back in 2008 when she took over the Special Needs Support Network Chair position. Theresa then moved into the Membership Coordinator volunteer position in 2010 when the structure at MBC switched from Office Manager to Executive Director.

When MBC decided to restructure again in 2015, moving back to an Office Manager, Theresa applied for the position and MBC decided she was the best candidate with her years of experience and

support with MBC. Theresa supports the Board of Directors performing the day to day tasks of running MBC answering calls and emails, helping to maintain the administrative side of MBC, and supporting the communication and promotional work of MBC. She also handles the membership support including direct member inquiries, and chapter membership organization. Theresa assists the Director of Finance by handling the day to day financial needs for MBC and doing the quarterly book-keeping.

Theresa offers administrative support to the Board of Directors during monthly Board meetings, and when they meet twice a year at Interim and again for MBC's AGM/Retreats.

Jessica has significant physical and intellectual disabilities, and much of Theresa's time is put into meeting her extensive care needs. After experiencing the loss of one of her twin sons, Kate Polley wrote her first book 'Sam and Finn' to share Sam's story with her surviving twin, Finn, as well as her family and friends.

Demand for the book spread and it was published and distributed worldwide, providing hope and comfort to many other families who had also suffered the devastating loss of a twin. Through Kates' dealings with bereaved families, she had many requests for the book to be personalised with a family's own child's name.

Since then there has been a whole range of personalised child and adult loss books created, including the 'one of a twin' version that mimics the original Sam and Finn book but with the names of the twins to be personalised and multiple loss book for those families who have experienced the bereavement of both twins.

Each book provides a beautiful tool for parents to teach young children to seek the many ways love can be found and fostered, even after the life of a loved one ends. It is also a powerful and encouraging message for adults, gently reminding those who are grieving, that our loved ones can be found in the world around us, in the little moments of our everyday lives, and in the love, that remains.
